Walter E. Monagan, Jr.

Born June 12, 1911, in Waterbury, Connecticut, Walter E. Monagan, Jr., 97, of Shelburne died July 14, 2008. After earning his bachelor's degree from the College of the Holy Cross in 1932, Monagan attended Yale Law School, graduating in 1935. After being admitted to the Connecticut Bar, he joined his father in the practice of law. He was later admitted to the Bar in Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., and Vermont. By 1938, he had a legal position with the Insurance Company of North America in Philadelphia. He served in World War II and served as a Military Government officer in Seoul, South Korea after the war. He also served during the Korean War and worked for the Army in Washington, D.C., and Paris France. His last government service job was as the attorney-in-charge of the War Claims Division of the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission in Washington. In 1970, he and his wife, Mildred, retired to Sudbury, Vermont, where they owned a small farm and he served on the select board. In 1974, he moved to Middlebury and in 1993 to Shelburne. He is survived by a brother, three sisters, and many nieces and nephews.
