Legal Member is a member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of the State of Vermont.

Retired member is a voting member of the VBA who has reached the age of 65 and has retired, except for pro bono representation.

Non-Resident Legal Member is a member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of Vermont who resides outside Vermont.

Law Professor Member is any full or part-time professor of law, while serving as such at an American Bar Association accredited law school located in the State of Vermont, who is not admitted to the practice of law in Vermont.

An **Associate Clerk Member** is:

- A law clerk registered with the Board of Bar Examiners of the Vermont Supreme Court and who is in at least the second year of a four-year study.
- An individual who has taken and passed the Vermont Bar Exam and is awaiting admission while completing their clerkship.
- An individual licensed to practice law in another jurisdiction who is awaiting admission while completing their clerkship.
- Admitted to practice law in any U.S. Jurisdiction

An **Associate Student Member** is enrolled in an accredited law school in the United States.

An **Associate Paralegal Member** is a paralegal certified by a Vermont attorney, according to the standards adopted by the Board of Managers (see VBA Constitution) or a voting member, in good standing, with the Vermont Paralegal Organization (the VPO).

A **70/40 Member** is an attorney who has been a VBA member 40 years and is 70 years of age. After this status is reached, this member no longer pay dues, but is entitled to all membership benefits.

An **Honorary Member** is a person elected by the Board of Managers to be an honorary member.
