VERMONT STUDENTS AND FAMILIES HAVE RIGHTS!



Because of money troubles or a loss of housing, do you...

- Move a lot?
- Live in a motel or shelter?
- Live with friends or relatives?
- Live in a vehicle or campground?
- Live without a parent or guardian?

If you said yes to any of these, you or your family may have special rights at school!



The Student's Best Interest is what Matters.

HAVE RIGHTS!

Homeless children and youth have the legal right to:

- Attend and enroll in classes
 <u>immediately</u> (without records)
- Stay in their school of origin (if it's in their best interest)
- Attend their new district's school
- Have transportation paid for by school
- Participate in <u>all</u> school-related activities, programs, and sports
- <u>Automatically</u> qualify for free meals at school

School Won't Allow Me or My Child to Enroll

 Federal law says schools <u>must</u> enroll homeless students

IMMEDIATELY!

- If the school refuses to enroll you or your child...
 - \Rightarrow Demand enrollment now!
 - ⇒ Meet with the school's "homeless liaison"
 - ⇒ Request a letter saying why the school refuses
 - ⇒ If you disagree, say you want to appeal
